CERT is a neighborhood-based program, focusing on your household and your neighbor's wellbeing, relating to immediate life-saving and life-sustaining needs following a major disaster* or event.

Vallejo CERT is comprised of a group of approximately 200 trained volunteers, with multiple disciplines such as Neighborhood Awareness, setting up and staffing shelters for evacuees, sandbag filling, search and rescue, and disaster preparedness.

Letter from the President

Happy spring Glen Cove! I say that as a technicality because it is currently in the 50's and raining. We are coming out of the first quarter of the year which is traditionally a quieter one. During the rainy weather fewer people make changes to their homes that require an architectural review. With that in mind, if you are planning an upgrade to your home, please check your Covenants, Codes, and Regulations (C.C. & R's). Copies can be found on our website at www.GlenCoveVallejo.com. Contact your neighborhood representative, or myself, and we can make sure that your plans are in compliance. Crime reports continue to be produced and are available on the website. January showed an increase in car thefts. There were 11 incidents which is double to triple the normal amount. That dropped back to 3 in February and the March numbers are not in yet. I often see reports throughout Vallejo on Next-door of these types of crimes. A few things can be done to prevent or at least discourage car thefts and break-ins. First, please do not leave anything visible in your car. Second, please lock your car doors. I failed to do this once (that I know of) and someone ransacked through my vehicle and stole a few items. Fortunately the items that were removed from my car were of no particular value. I tend to follow my own advice and not leave valuables in my car. The third suggestion is a really important one. Get to know your neighbors and help each other out by being vigilant. The more eyes and communication, the less likely an intruder will venture into the area. Police departments note that criminal elements often follow social media to determine areas that are easy prey to car thefts and break-ins. Let's work together to ensure that criminal elements know that Glen Cove is not easy prey to criminals. Vehicle issues aside, crime in Glen Cove remains about the same.



One of the big topics of conversation at our last board meeting was membership. While the membership is still a big part of Glen Cove, we can always use more members. The \$20 a year membership fee goes to pay for supplies, event production (we have to pay for the use of the school for meetings, refreshments, etc...), website, promotional materials, and general operating cost that fall on a non-profit. Are you still a member? If you are not sure, feel free to send us an email and we can check your membership status! Are your neighbors members? Every little bit helps. Finally, it's time to clean out the garage (my plan for this week) and get your unwanted items ready for the 2019 Glen Cove Community Garage Sale. A Not So Common Weed

With all the rain this winter weeds have been growing aggressively. They are considered weeds because most aren't wanted, they grow fast, crowd out other plants, and take away nutrients and water from the soil. Although crabgrass and cut leaf geraniums are proliferating, this article is about one specie that is, at least to me, of interest.

This plant appeared in my yard during the last decade. It appears in the spring and dies off during the long dry summer. It has very delicate, petite white/cream colored flowers with purple tips. I would describe it as attractive; however, it is growing with a vengeance all over the back slope of my yard. When I was unable to identify it, I asked several Master Gardeners if they could do so. When they were stumped, I decided to bring out the big guns by contacting the University of California Cooperative Extension office in Fairfield, 707-389-0645.



My mystery plant was identified! Its scientific name is *Fumaria capreolata* and has several common names including white ramping fumitory and climbing fumitory. I had never heard the word 'fumitory' and assumed it was a place where people smoked. As an annual *F. capreolata* lives for one year, spreads its seeds, dies, and emerges the following spring as the seeds germinate and the new plants emerge.

F. capreolata is native to Europe, western Asia, and northern Africa but has spread to Australia and the Americas. It belongs to the poppy family, *Papaveraceae*. The genus *Fumaria* contains over 50 species. Many of these plants are used as herbal supplements.

According to one source, the Roman historian, Pliny The Elder, named the plant *Kapnos*, which means smoke, presumably because its juice brings on tears making it seem as though one were looking through smoke. Another species *F. officinalis* has slightly greyish leaves that give the appearance from a distance of smoke coming from the ground especially during the occurrence of morning dew.



F. capreolata has small (under one-half inch) light green leaves with three lobes. The leaves are opposite and have smooth margins. The stems can grow up to a meter long and the plants can be sufficiently dense that they smother nearby, low-growing plants.

The extract from plants in the *Fumaria* genus has a variety of uses. These include use as a laxative and diuretic. It has also been used for eye irritation, skin conditions, heart problems, and constipation.

My crop of *F. capreolata* is growing through the wood chip mulch I generously spread last year. The three inches of chips, however, settled and don't provide the barrier I had hoped to have. There are several ways to eliminate weeds including the use of chemicals, solarization, burning, and pulling them out. The most environmentally friendly choice, although labor intensive, is the latter.

A fortunate characteristic of this plant is that it is relatively easy to pull out as its root system gives little resistance especially after rain when the ground is soft. While I have grown somewhat fond of these plants, the wisest course is to remove as many as possible before they drop their seeds.

Vallejo's new Fire Chief brings experience, leadership and energy.



In January, the City of Vallejo announced the hiring of a new Fire Chief, Daryl C. Arbuthnott. In total, Chief Arbuthnott brings more than 37 years of experience in local government and Fire service, having worked for the City of Los Angeles, serving in the capacity of Fire Inspector, Fire Fighter and up the ranks to Deputy Chief. Prior to his arrival in January, Arbuthnott was the Fire Chief for the City of Davis. Chief Arbuthnott officially joined the City of Vallejo on January 14, 2019.

A native of Los Angeles, Chief Arbuthnott concluded his Los Angeles career managing 39 fire stations, the air operations section, and overseeing 1,117 uniformed members covering more than 274 square miles. Chief Arbuthnott's vast experience includes commanding several nationally recognized large-scale brush fires, high-rise and commercial buildings, swift water rescue, active shooter incidents and special planned events.

City Manager Greg Nyhoff, who you will recall spoke at a Glen Cove Community Association meeting in 2018, said, "I am pleased to appoint Chief Arbuthnott to the position of Vallejo Fire Chief. He is very experienced in all aspects of Fire Service and will be a great leader for our Fire Department personnel. Chief Arbuthnott is an excellent communicator who will engage in the community and partner with businesses and neighborhoods."

Chief Arbuthnott has established a reputation of cultivating organizational leadership and strategies that extend into training, mentoring, and personnel development. He also brings a commitment to

Chief Arbuthnott obtained a Bachelor's of Science Degree in Public Administration from Union Institute & University and a Masters of Business Administration Degree in Risk Management, Business Continuity & Security from Boston University.

When we met in February, Chief Arbuthnott shared that he had toured Glen Cove. It was obvious that he had studied Glen Cove. For example, he was aware of fires that have originated along I-80, and how they impacted Glen Cove residents. He also knew that Glen Cove has an aging population and wants to address the EMS needs that communities like ours will have.

Working with a consultant, the Chief will create a "Standards of Cover" plan for all of Vallejo. This plan will include recommendations for staffing, call times, equipment needs, etc. Chief Arbuthnott will present this detailed report to City Manager Nyhoff.

The Glen Cove Community Association will extend an invitation to Fire Chief Arbuthnott to address Glen Cove residents at a future community meeting. You'll enjoy the evening. The chief is gregarious and very willing to take resident questions.

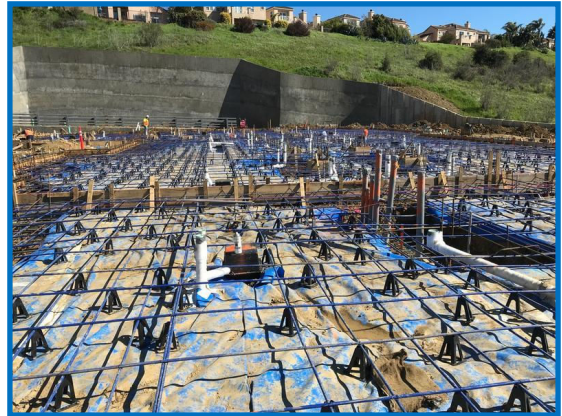

They have since progressed.



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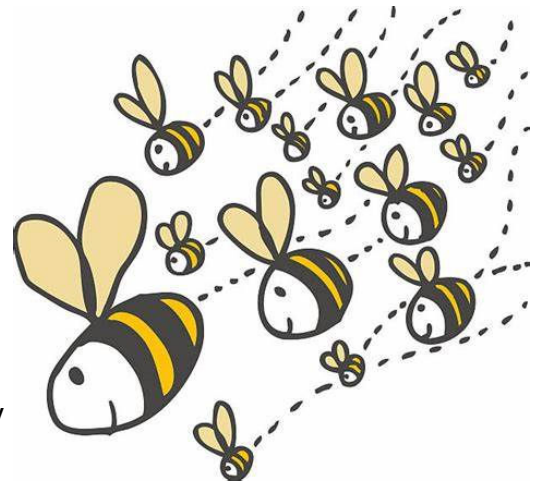
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Help! I have a beehive in my Backyard!

One day I was sitting in my family room when I noticed a buzzing sound. I looked out my window and saw a dark cloud of bees hovering over my backyard. Luckily my dogs had just come inside.

It seems that the bees had chosen to land on a bush located on the hillside adjacent to my house. At first it looked as if a mass of bees had landed on the same branch. After an hour they formed into what looked like an upside down pineapple! As it turns out the upside down pineapple consisted of approximately 10,000 bees. When my husband came home he bravely went outside to look at it. The hive appeared to be made up of Honeybees. Since Honeybees are an endangered species we decided to wait and see if they would fly away in a day or two. In the meantime the dogs, children, and loud noises were not allowed in the backyard.



According to Wikipedia, this is a very common thing to happen within the first two or three weeks of spring. Swarming is when the Honeybees engorge themselves with honey and search of a new home. The bees can only live two or three days away from the main hive before they begin to die. I looked online to see what options were available to removing the hive. There are many bee removal services available. Removal efforts can include smoking the hive and removing it, using insecticides, carefully relocating the hive, or using a white sheet sprayed with sugar water that causes the hive to drop on to the sheet. Very scary and should only be undertaken by professionals.

I considered contacting a master gardener, a local honeybee keeper, or even the local college. The University of California at Davis has a Honey and Pollination Center.

Dr. Harry H. Laidlaw leads the Honeybee Laidlaw Research Center and there's a Haagen-Dazs Honeybee Haven (facility) and a 1/2 acre bee friendly garden that is open to the public.

In our case we waited two days and on the third morning the bees started to leave. The hive formed into a large dark buzzing cloud that hovered for about 10 to 15 minutes until every bee was in the cloud. All of a sudden the cloud lifted and moved on through the trees and over into next yard and beyond until I could no longer see it. Sometimes it's better to let nature take its course.



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
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PARTICIPATORY BUDGETING VOTE: NOW THROUGH APRIL 30!

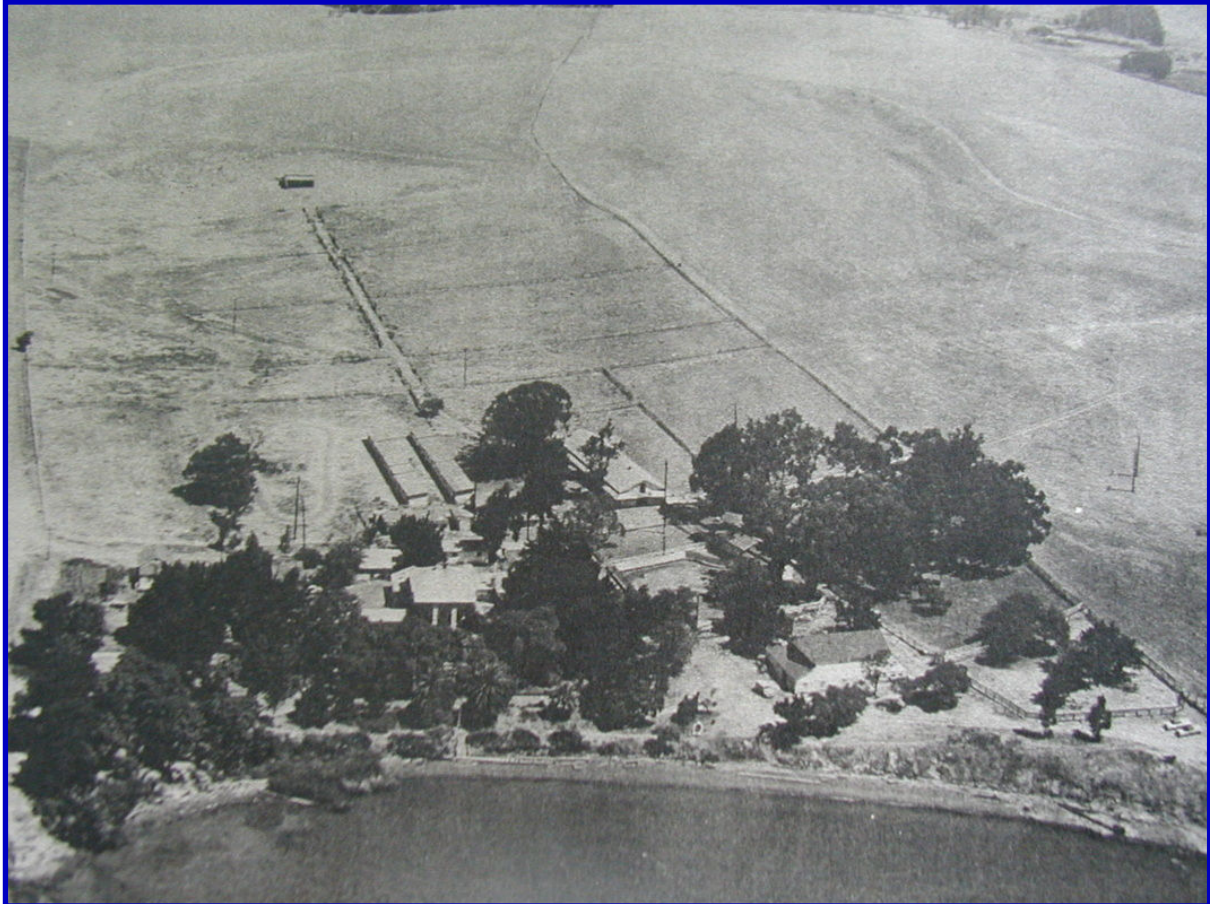
