#### A CONCERNED CITIZEN


As a homeowner and taxpayer living in the Glen Cove area, I have always expected a tranquil quality of life in my retirement age because I worked diligently all my adult life for it. This expectation is now being violated by a group of activists who have encamped to protest the proposed park development site for the last two months. Their daily activities of drum beating, chanting, bringing traffic and parking all along our streets



have been a constant source of annoyance and frustration for our residents.

There is a new fear that this encampment will become a haven for the homeless persons who may have been encouraged to come and support the protestors who are already on site. There have been flyers inviting anyone in the San Francisco area to come join in.

Our trust and dependability in the City's officials and Police Department has deteriorated beyond a doubt because they have allowed this situation to continue. We have taken our concerns to the City Council, City Manager and GVRD but have seen little action. We know that according to our Civil Rights, government must protect the Civil rights of its citizens. The police department is a civil institution to help and protect local citizens. Both departments have been sadly lacking in enforcing



Our hope that this dilemma will soon be resolved is steadily dissolving. How much longer will it be before this beautiful neighborhood is restored back into that "once upon a time" peaceful setting?

#### "KNOCK, KNOCK" - WHO IS REALLY THERE? -

#### The Problem:

Squatters and Robberies are the issue. They might look like neighbors but they don't belong there. They don't rent, own or even know the property owner's name. They pay no taxes or HOA dues. They could be drug dealers, homeless, thieves, scam artists and more. Regardless, they are a nuisance and a safety threat to the Glen Cove community. Or you may have a knock on the door and find it is a burglar.

#### The History:

Squatters manage to break into empty homes and set up "housekeeping" – even turning on utilities. Stolen cars are often parked in the driveway. Two weeks ago squatters enjoyed a party in the driveway of an empty home on Wellington Place with two unleashed pit bulls at the edge of the driveway.


Two weeks earlier squatters were removed from an empty home on Bayhurst. This occurred after a long and frustrating removal process. There have been reported incidents throughout the Glen Cove Developments. Aside from the fact squatters anger tax paying Glen Cove Homeowners there are other important consequences that can affect each one of us:

- 1. Our home values are threatened due to lack of property maintenance
- 2. Neighbors become fearful for their safety and that of their children
- 3. Many times the interior of the homes are trashed
- 4. Often the squatters do not have any established utility and use alternate heating sources that can cause fires

There have also been reports of non-residents knocking on doors late at night – and even during the day who are planning to rob your home.

#### What can YOU Do?

- 1. Be aware of who your neighbors are. "Knock Knock" who is really there?
- 2. Make certain you install theft deterrents. Central Alarm, Motion Lights, Beware of Dog signs and camera surveillance systems. These will help protect your property as well as deter anyone from trying to break into an empty house to squat.
- 3. IF you notice something that is not right different cars every day people coming and going when you know a house is empty DO NOT try to solve the problem alone. Call the Police, contact a neighbor or your HOA president or neighborhood representative.
  - 4. Hopefully your development has or is establishing a neighborhood watch.



#### Reminder:

With reduced public safety services in Vallejo it is imperative that the citizens take the reign to resolve local issues as much as possible. Awareness is key. Be sure you know who is on the other side of the door before you open it.

Become involved in your local development and the Glen Cove community:

- 1. Attend development meeting and read your developments Newsletter and the CC&Rs.
- 2. Join the Glen Cove Community Association (just \$20/year) and attend the General Meetings!
- 3. Let us know if you would like to participate in a neighborhood watch

#### A Message from the Board President

**GLEN COVE NATURE AREA** – has been occupied by protesters for several months. The Greater Vallejo Recreational District (G.V.R.D.) developed a plan to restore the area to its original state with minimal infrastructure that would include restrooms and a small parking lot. G.V.R.D. went through a very lengthy protocol to develop the plan that included town hall meetings, and input from the American Indian/Native American groups that have been designated by the State of California as the most likely descendents of the site.

The site has been occupied by protesters who believe that the "plan" would desecrate an area considered sacred by American Indian/Native American groups. The protesters do not want the site developed. There has been a lot said about the occupation and the G.V.R.D. plan from all sides of the issue. Some comments have been inflammatory and misinformed.

First, please know that the Glen Cove Community Association would never support a plan that is knowingly disrespectful or that would desecrate a sacred site. We have the utmost respect for American Indian/Native American groups as we do for all people. We know that there are good people on all sides of this issue. If we support the plan, it's because we know that the plan does not target or desecrate sacred areas. Glen Cove residents appear to be divided over the issues although a growing number of residents who live near the site would like to see the occupation end regardless of which side they support. Having said that, all points of view should be respected and our hope is that the issues that precipitated the occupation will be resolved soon. Inquiries regarding the plan should be directed to G.V.R.D.

**NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH** – we printed several newsletter articles late last year and earlier this year about Neighborhood Watch programs and hope that you and your neighbors have become better organized. Residents are often not motivated to organize a Neighborhood Watch program group until after they've been burglarized.

Neighborhood Watch programs in Vallejo are overseen by an organization known as Fighting Back Partnership. Fighting Back is a non-profit agency that partners with businesses, residents, community organizations and local governments to improve neighborhoods, strengthen families, and support youth development. There has been a surge in the formation of neighborhood watch programs lately and this has been credited, at least in part, with an overall reduction in violent crime throughout Vallejo. CANDIDATES NIGHT FORUM – September 29<sup>th</sup> is the date that has been set for a Glen Cove Community Meeting that will provide a forum for candidates running for either City Council or Mayor to meet and respond to questions from the Glen Cove Community. The location for the forum is the Glen Cove elementary school. We have learned from past experience that a completely open question and answer format usually bogs down when a few people start asking specific detailed questions that are unique to their own circumstances or areas of interest. Time is very limited during Candidates Night and we make very effort to ensure that a broad range of issues are covered. In an effort to ensure this, neighborhood representatives will develop a list of questions, based on community feedback that will cover a wide range of issues. Questions are never made available to candidates prior to the forum.



### **Grab Bag - Questions & Answers**

**Garbage and Recycling Bins** – I've noticed that lots of Glen Cove residents have taken to positioning their garbage and recycling bins on front side yards within sight of the street instead of placing them out of sight in the garage or yard. Is it OK to do this?

With the exception of pickup days or the evening before, garbage and recycling bins should not be visible from the street. Per Vallejo Municipal Code (V.M.C.) 7.54.030, R & 7.44 020C., residents who fail to remove the bins risk being cited. Administrative fees for violations start at \$280.00.



**Blocked Views** – When I originally bought my home I had a great view of the Carquinez Strait. Now, trees that are located both on private property and on Landscape Management Department (LMD) property have begun to block my view. Is there anything that can be done about this?

The issue of protected and or blocked views is a big one in Glen Cove. Our hilly setting affords dramatic views for many residents. Some of our developments have Covenants, Codes, and Regulations (C.C. &R.'s) that address the protected view issue but most do not.

Absent a specific C.C. & R. provision that provides guidance on this issue, the view issue becomes more complicated. Even C.C. & R.'s that address the issue do not cover most view issues. The best way to resolve a blocked view is to negotiate with a neighbor or resident. You may have better luck if the tree is located on LMD property. For more complicated situations, contact me for more information.

Codes, Covenants, and Restrictions (C.C. & R.'s) in Glen Cove - Why are there different sets of C.C. & R.'s in Glen Cove and can they be consolidated?

We've addressed this in a previous newsletter. Basically, each of Glen Coves 22 developments was created separately with different sets of C.C. & R.'s. While most of the C.C. &R.'s conform to a core of common requirements, some have added additional requirements. This has made enforcement difficult. The board is still working to create a new website which will include the C.C.&R.'s for the developments that have them plus a copy of the master set that covers the developments that do not.
