Values Up - According to most reputable sources, the housing market is beginning to improve throughout the Bay Area, including Solano County and Vallejo. This does not mean that the real-estate market is out of the woods yet, but we have noticed a modest increase in the number of requests for permits in Glen Cove to remodel kitchens, bathrooms, and in some cases to add square footage to existing rooms. Please remember that any project that requires a permit from the city will first require a review by the Glen Cove Association Board Architectural Review Committee. Most projects involve reasonable changes or improvements and the overwhelming majority of requests for permits (99%) are approved.



BEWARE: MUSHROOMS EVERYWHERE!



While humans usually know enough to avoid consuming mushrooms that grow in the wild, your pet may not be as cautious. Some fabulous wild fungi can be a really big problem for anyone who eats them, including the family dog. This is the time of year that we see mushrooms sprout seemingly overnight. Some are harmless, while some are deadly; telling the difference should be left only to the experts.

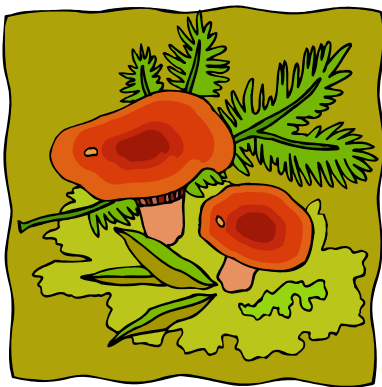
The true incidence of toxic wild mushroom ingestion in dogs is not known. This fact is largely due to the non-specific symptoms of mushroom toxicity. If no one witnesses the dog eating mushrooms, it may not even be suspected until it's too late.

When a dog eats toxic mushrooms, the initial symptoms can be abdominal pain, vomiting, and bloody diarrhea. These initial symptoms can occur within a few hours of ingestion, but may subside within 2-3 days. The second stage of the toxicity is much more dangerous. Severe liver failure in this second phase can cause loss of appetite, bleeding tendencies, depression, and coma and kidney failure.

There are no specific antidotes for toxic wild mushroom ingestion. The degree of toxicity, and the likelihood of recovery, depends on many factors but the amount of mushrooms eaten is key to recovery. Additionally, if the pet has timely access to veterinary care after ingestion (ideally within 1-2 hours after ingestion), some steps can be taken to lessen the amount of toxin absorbed by the intestinal tract, which can dramatically improve the odds of survival.

The symptoms mentioned above are common to many illnesses so unless the pet owner witnesses his/her dog eating mushrooms or finds mushrooms in the dog vomitus, most of these pets are treated with general supportive measures based on the symptoms they present, which usually include hospitalization for intravenous fluids and monitoring of organ function. Once the liver is damaged, there may be little that can be done—short of a liver transplant. The last time we checked, liver transplants were not available for dogs—at least, not yet.

If you see your dog eating mushrooms, or even if you suspect it, you should immediately contact your veterinarian. Time is critical here, and an hour or two may be the difference between your dog surviving or not. When you go to the veterinary hospital, bring with you any material your dog might have already vomited as this may reveal some mushroom remnants that may guide the doctor's treatments during those critical first few hours.



Of course it's a lot easier to prevent mushroom ingestion in the first place. Don't let your dog have access to areas where mushrooms may be cropping up (open space, some public parks, etc.). Monitor your yard closely this time of year, especially under trees such as oaks and birches, as these are common places to find mushrooms. Carefully remove and dispose of any mushrooms you may find in your yard. Unless you are an expert in identifying mushroom types, assume that all mushrooms are poisonous.

Grab Bag - Questions & Answers and sometimes just answers...

I'm glad that street repairs are underway but are there any other Tax Surplus Fund projects scheduled for Glen Cove?

Yes, we will soon have speed radar signs installed at two locations on Glen Cove Parkway (see more information on page 9) and will propose other enhancements at the intersection of Glen Cove Parkway and North Regatta Dr. to further improve pedestrian safety in the area by the elementary school. We will also continue to push for security cameras at key locations within Glen Cove.



I continue to see a downward spiral on my street relative to property maintenance and other violations. Why isn't something being done to require compliance with our rules?

This question is repeated almost daily and I realize how frustrating it can be to have neighbors who do not properly maintain their property or, worse, neighbors who exhibit social behavioral problems. While these types of problems are thankfully not common in Glen Cove compared to elsewhere in the city, we take them very seriously and work closely with the city to address them on a case-by-case basis.

We have been assured by the new city manager that code enforcement is one of his priorities and that every effort is being made to increase the number of public safety employees to better respond to complaints. If you need assistance in dealing with a code enforcement problem or public safety issue, please contact the appropriate city office (numbers provided in the newsletter) or contact your neighborhood representative for consultation. Our combined efforts usually resolve most problems.

Glen Cove Needs You!

The Glen Cove Community Association Board needs members who will represent their respective neighborhoods on the Board. The Board consists of representatives from the subdivisions (developments) that make up the Glen Cove community. There are presently five developments that are not represented (see the Board President's message on Page 2 for the list).

We need volunteers from each development within Glen Cove to keep the lines of communication open with residents and to ensure that the Codes, Covenants, and Restrictions are enforced to high community standards. The primary duties of a development representative are:

- Maintain, in good standing, membership in the Glen Cove Community Association, which is open to all Glen Cove residents and costs only \$20 per year.
- Attend monthly Board meetings and the General Meetings of the Association that are scheduled three times a year.
- Represent the development on issues that come before the Board. Issues may involve landscape areas, code enforcement problems, criminal activity, or responding to residents' complaints or inquiries.
- At least quarterly, conduct a visual inspection of the development (neighborhood) for compliance with Vallejo Municipal Codes (VMC), and/or the Codes, Covenants, and Restrictions (CC & Rs) of the Glen Cove Community Association.
- Act as the Architectural Review person when residents propose changes to their homes, especially if the changes will require a city issued building permit. No technical skills are required for this function.
- Assist residents in resolutions of minor issues within the community or between neighbors whenever possible or practical. It should be clearly understood that Glen Cove Board representatives are not mediators and do not represent individual residents on serious issues.
- Study and maintain the Reference Guide notebook provided by the Glen Cove Community Association. The Reference Guide contains a lot of important information that helps the representatives perform their duties.

Radar Speed Signs . . . Coming Soon!

The City of Vallejo Public Works Department has proposed to install Electronic Speed Radar Signs at two locations on the Glen Cove Parkway. Two signs, one in each direction, will be placed on the downhill stretch of the parkway just before the Glen Cove Elementary School and a second set of signs will be placed on the downhill (uphill) stretch of the parkway between Mistral and the Marina. Additional Speed Radar Signs may be positioned at a later date elsewhere in Glen Cove depending on their effectiveness at the two locations noted above.

The Vallejo Police Department's Traffic Division believes that electronic signs discourage speeding and enhance public safety. We will communicate the installation schedule via the next newsletter and/or through the G.C.C.A. website when the schedule date has been determined.

Bob said that during the first holiday season after Debbra had passed away, his two other daughters approached him and exclaimed, “Come on, Dad, let’s decorate for Deb!” Since then, Bob and Linda have welcomed neighborhood visitors to their holiday display, which includes thousands of lights, a hand-made carousel and Ferris wheel (both at least 50 years old and lovingly restored by the Taylors), and unique hand-crafted holiday statues purchased from the Philippines.

Blowup dolls of holiday favorites like Frosty the Snowman and Santa Claus decorate the grounds for visitors who drive by or stroll through the Taylors’ front yard. Each night, Bob and his wife greet visitors and hand out candy canes. Even Santa Claus makes an appearance during the Friday and Saturday nights before Christmas to hear the wish-lists of neighborhood children. Sometimes, Santa arrives at the house on a fire truck, accompanied by elves. “The kids go so crazy,” said Bob.

It takes Bob and Linda two and a half months to set up the display. Each year, the couple seeks to improve upon the previous year by procuring high-quality decorations and lights. Next year, they hope to purchase energy efficient LED lights to reduce their \$2,600 electric bill for the month of December. (A sign at the Taylors’ driveway suggests, “If you like what you see, you can donate to PG&E!”)

Bob estimates that one thousand people visit each day from all across the Bay Area. Local visitors often bring along their out-of-town friends and family, so he has even met people from other states and other countries, including Germany and Australia.



Since the Glen Cove Fire Station closed two years ago, Bob and Linda have taken on the responsibility of collecting items for the Toys for Tots program from the Fire Department. Thus far, visitors have donated fourteen industrial-size bags worth of donated toys. “That’s us working with the Fire Department, and they, in turn, bring Santa Claus and the elves to our house on a fire truck,” said Bob. The Toys for Tots drop-off box will remain at the Taylor home until December 31.

The Taylors’ display of holiday lights will be up until January 1, 2013, and donations are welcome.
