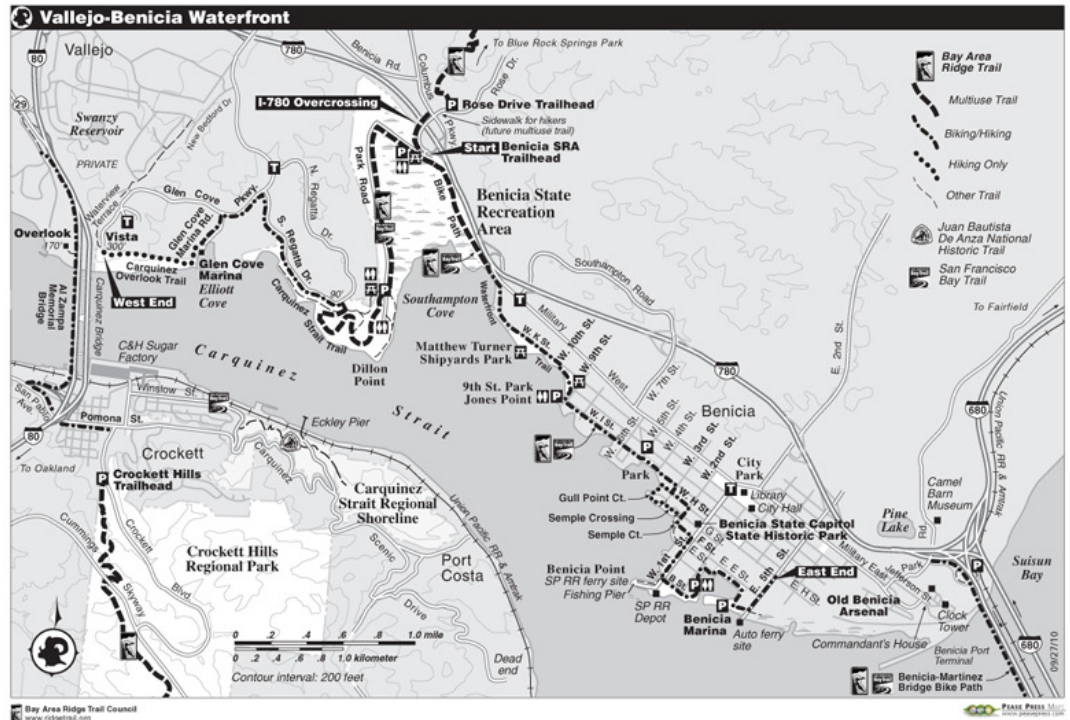

Dogs, Leashes and Trails

Reasons for having dogs leashed, in light of a report of a leashed dog being attacked by one that was unleashed, is the comfort levels for homeowners and other pedestrians who are afraid of dogs, however well-behaved the dogs may appear, and the security of property and pets along one's path.

On trails throughout Glen Cove, the confusion on who owns the property is understandable. After talking to several agencies and various divisions at the City of Vallejo, we learned that most trails are owned by the City of Vallejo and are maintained by the City and volunteer group under the Trail sponsor.


Linda Ljuba, head of the Landscape Division for the City of Vallejo said City ordinances require dogs to be leashed on city property. She reiterates to all concerned that dog owners are responsible to keep their dogs on leash while on trails and streets. There are dog parks, Vallejo's Wardlaw Dog Park and Benicia Community Park, in the area where dog owners may




unleash their dogs. Ms. Ljuba is currently going through City Hall to get the go-ahead to have trail areas posted as leash only, but in the meantime, the law should be followed. She also is directing the brush clearing on and around the trails in order to keep it safe from fires.

This trail runs 3.5 miles east from Benicia SRA trailhead to Benicia Point or from SRA trail head west to Carquinez Bridge Overlook for 3.5 miles.

A Message from the Board President, Miguel Castillo

GLEN COVE NATURE AREA PROTEST OCCUPATION RESOLVED – After a protest occupation that lasted more than 90 days, the Greater Vallejo Recreation District (G.V.R.D.), the City of Vallejo, and the Most Likely Descendants (MLD's) of the Glen Cove Nature Area site entered into an agreement that provides for MLD oversight of projects proposed for the Nature Area and access to the area as part of a permanent cultural conservation easement. The MLD's paid the City of Vallejo \$100,000.00 as part of the agreement. While the protesters and their representatives were not a party to the agreement they have said that they support the agreement.

G.V.R.D. originally developed a plan to restore the area to its natural state with some minimal infrastructure improvements. The improvements would have included a small parking lot, a restroom, and paved paths. The plan also called for the cleanup of the area and the demolition of a mansion that is located on the site. The planning process spanned anywhere from 6 and half to 14 years or more depending on who you talk to. Regardless of the time spent, the planning included the participation of MLD's and Native American Archeologists from the University of California, Berkeley. G.V.R.D. believed that it had complied with all legal requirements during the planning stages of the project including the participation of the Native American tribal interest groups that have been designated by the State of California as the MLD's related to the site. The final agreement removes the bathroom from the plan and scales down the



size of the parking lot which will be relocated to a less sensitive area.



Glen Cove residents were divided over the occupation. Some residents supported the protesters, others did not. Regardless of which side you may have supported an agreement has been reached and hopefully we can all move forward together. The agreement does not give everybody everything they wanted, but it does give most people what they can accept. The area will continue to function as a public park with full public access while

tribal interest groups will have cultural conservation rights as part of an easement and will be consulted on projects related to the park. We have been advised by the Vallejo Police Department that from this point forward, the City will enforce all Code Violations related to public parks.

Major Changes to Glen Cove's Landscape Management District Contract

The common area landscaping along Glen Cove's Parkway medians and side-slopes and open areas is maintained by contractors under Landscape Maintenance District (LMD) contracts with the City of Vallejo which are administered by the City's LMD Inspectors within the Public Works Department. Each residence in Glen Cove pays an annual assessment to support the near \$500,000 district budget that is levied against annual property tax bills. There have been a number of changes to LMD operations in Glen Cove I & II and Glen Cove III as reflected in the current fiscal year contract. There has also been a major change to the City's management personnel and supervision assigned to our area. As a result, a Glen Cove Community Association (GCCA) subcommittee comprised of Miguel Castillo, Board President, and Dennis Albright, Ex-Officio Board Member, met with Assistant Maintenance Superintendent James Nichols and recently assigned LMD Inspector Linda Ljuba this past July to discuss the reasons for, and the impact of these changes. After analyzing the results of the meeting, questions arose which require further clarification and discussion. Miguel has forwarded a letter to the Maintenance Superintendent requesting a meeting for that purpose. Accordingly the following issues from the July meeting need to be resolved.

- The new contract was changed substantially from a comprehensive document which covered all aspects of LMD maintenance which was bid in the previous year for \$217,000, to a line item type contract containing a list of specific tasks for \$96,000. Mr. Nichols stated that this would probably result in adjustments to cover gaps in the scope of work. Mr. Nichols plans to put the contract back out to bid in the January.
- The width of fire breaks in open areas behind residences and the borders of open areas have been expanded to 100 feet from the previously 25 foot perimeter per Fire Department direction. While this will increase costs for this work, it will certainly provide greater protection to residences from wildfires originating in open areas.
- Graffiti removal from LMD assets such as irrigation control panels is the responsibility of the contractor on a routine basis.
- We need to see contract language that specifies detailed planting requirements that can be enforced by LMD Inspectors to assure that all new plant materials are properly installed. This has been a problem in the past that has contributed to the failure of many shrubs and plants.
- Mr. Nichols stated that major repairs are required to the irrigation systems and the loop system configuration should be upgraded.
- Mr. Nichols agreed that the contract called for a specified amount of bark type material that is to be applied to parkway medians and side slopes each year.
- There are currently 3 LMD Inspectors for all the city's approximately 20 LMD areas. Our currently assigned LMD Inspector is also assigned to two other LMDs.

Glen Cove's LMD III is in a near deficit status due to failure of residents to support the only LMD assessment increase brought to a vote in over 20 years. As a result there is no funding for rehabilitation and replacement of our degraded plant material in various areas. We requested that the City evaluate the possibility of using some of the surplus infrastructure bond funding revenues for this purpose.

There will be follow-up articles on this subject in future issues of the newsletter.

Wire Thefts

Glen Cove residents have become increasingly aware that street lights are out in several locations within Glen Cove. We forward reports of the outages to the appropriate City Department as we receive or become aware of them. The City has advised that the street light outages are the direct result of wire thefts and that the thefts have occurred in about forty locations throughout Vallejo.

Most of the thefts occur in places where houses do not face a street such as in the case of the first two blocks of North Regatta, and along a stretch of South Regatta that runs from the Glen Cove Parkway downhill past Whiteside. There are also several other locations within Glen Cove.

Please continue to report street light outages to your neighborhood representative. The outages will be monitored and the city will be kept informed. The city is working to repair the damage caused by the thefts and will keep us posted on developments.

Grab Bag - Questions & Answers and sometimes just answers....



Signs, Signs, and more Signs - The Covenants, Codes, and Regulations for my development prohibit the posting of signs in front of homes with the possible exception of temporary real estate signs. I've noticed that some people have placed political signs on their front lawns during campaign seasons. Isn't it a violation of the C.C. & R. s to do this?

Glen Cove's developments have prohibitions against posting signs (exception for temporary real estate signs) on a front lawn or anywhere that is visible from the street. The prohibition was written into the C.C. & R.s over twenty-five years ago and may not have taken into consideration certain legal "rights." The board has consulted with attorneys and it appears that the prohibition of political signs posted for temporary periods should "not" be enforced, at least not for now. We do however ask that signs be limited to a standard size (typical of real estate signs) and they should never be placed on Landscape Management District property. All oversized signs and commercial signs of any type are strictly prohibited.

Who Should I Call?? – We regularly receive calls from residents to request that board members/neighborhood reps contact a city department on their behalf to resolve problems, arrange for permits, research information, and for a wide variety of other reasons. Please understand that we do not have a staff that can provide this type or level of service on an ongoing basis. While we are glad to help when we can we must depend on residents to help themselves as much as possible before contacting us.

In an effort to help you connect with the appropriate city department we provide a Neighbor & Community Directory on the second to the last page of every Glen Cove Newsletter. Please tear the directory page from the newsletter and save the page until the next newsletter arrives with an updated directory. Most residents affix the directory to a bulletin board or to their refrigerator door.

Covenants, Codes, and Restrictions (C.C. & R.'s) prohibit garbage cans and recycling bins to be visible from the street (except on pickup day or the evening before) - Why do so many residents continue to leave garbage cans and recycling bins on the front side yard clearly visible from the street when C.C. & R.'s prohibit this?

We've addressed this issue in previous newsletters and have warned residents that the city could at any time issue a citation for this infraction of Vallejo Municipal Code 7 44.020C yet dozens of residents continue to violate the code by placing garbage "cans" in locations where they are visible from the street. It is unsightly to leave cans in front of your home even if positioned in a side yard. The Glen Cove Board will continue to encourage the city to enforce this code violation. Violators are forewarned.

Why must I secure the Association's sign-off when applying for a city issued permit? The City requires that residents secure the sign-off of Home Owner or Community Associations anytime they apply for a city permit. Permits are usually required for modifications or improvements to your home and for a wide variety of other projects. Always please check with the city first to see if a permit is required for your project. If a permit is required, contact your neighborhood representative who will walk you through the process. Some projects may require association approval but not a city permit so check with your neighborhood rep to avoid misunderstandings.

Please note that C.C. & R.'s are certified by the city and are part of the overall permit process. Permits and Architectural Reviews by associations are intended to ensure compliance with C. C. & R.'s as well as with Vallejo Municipal Codes and to ensure that a resident does not alter their property in such a way that would negatively impact others.
