


The Importance of CERT in Glen Cove

Having a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) in your city is critical for enhancing overall preparedness, safety, and resilience during emergencies and disasters. Here's why it's important:

1. Immediate Response

CERT volunteers are trained to respond immediately to disasters or emergencies, filling the gap before professional first responders arrive. This can save lives and reduce the severity of injuries or damage.

2. Community Resilience

A CERT program empowers residents to take an active role in disaster preparedness. Trained individuals can assist their neighbors, especially vulnerable populations, which strengthens the entire community's resilience.

3. Support for First Responders

During large-scale emergencies, professional responders can become overwhelmed. CERT volunteers provide crucial support by handling low-priority tasks, allowing first responders to focus on critical incidents.

4. Training and Awareness

CERT training educates participants on disaster preparedness, basic first aid, fire suppression, and search-and-rescue operations. This knowledge benefits not just the trainees but also their families and communities.

5. Risk Reduction

A CERT program helps identify risks within the community and prepares individuals to mitigate them. For example, volunteers may conduct community outreach, assist with evacuation plans, or help create fire-safe neighborhoods like those recognized by the FireWise program.

6. Cost-Effective Resource

CERT volunteers provide invaluable support at minimal cost to the city. They are a force multiplier for emergency management without requiring the budget of professional personnel.

7. Enhanced Collaboration

CERT promotes collaboration among residents, local government, and other emergency management organizations, fostering trust and a more unified response to emergencies.

For Glen Cove, with its focus on FireWise initiatives, a CERT program would complement efforts to address fire safety and other risks while increasing overall preparedness.

We are trying to bring CERT back into focus in Vallejo.



Volunteer Opportunities

The Solano Resource Conservation District, founded in 1956, is an entity that helps landowners and other residents manage their natural resources. The SRCD has been a consistent presence in Glen Cove during the last few years. It has managed the planting of a wide variety of native shrubs and grasses in the GC Waterfront Park off Whitesides Drive. More recently it has overseen the planting of oak seedlings and other natives in the state parks land along South Regatta Drive.



The work of the SRCD is making the already attractive open spaces in our area along the Carquinez Strait more beautiful. It is an ongoing effort to replace invasive species with natives and manage those already planted.

The SRCD needs you! They have put out a call for people to volunteer on the third Wednesday of every month at the Glen Cove Waterfront Park. The work will include weeding near already installed plants as well as planting new ones. They will provide the necessary tools but volunteers should dress appropriately and bring their own gloves and water. The work parties will take place unless there is heavy rain.

In order to volunteer, please email: john.woodruff@solanorcd.org. You will be notified of the starting time for each Wednesday work party as they may vary depending on weather and time of year. You will also be sent the volunteer event list so that you will be aware of other related happenings. Many of these events take place on Saturdays, times when those who can't make the Wednesday work parties may be available. These efforts provide great opportunities for you to improve the area where you live!

School Driving Safety

Here are some key tips for driving safely near schools:



Slow down – Always reduce your speed in school zones, especially during pick-up and drop-off times. Watch for posted speed limits.

Stay alert – Children can be unpredictable. Keep your eyes open for kids crossing streets, walking between parked cars, or riding bikes.

Obey stop lights and stop Signs. During school drop off and pickup times, please stay in the left lane if you are not going into the school.

Never pass a stopped school bus – If the bus has flashing red lights and the stop sign extended, traffic in both directions must stop (unless divided by a physical median).



Watch for crosswalks – Yield to pedestrians and never block a crosswalk while waiting at a light.

Avoid distractions – Don't text, eat, or use your phone. You need your full attention in school zones.

Be cautious in parking lots – Many accidents happen in school parking areas because of limited visibility and kids darting between cars.

Plan extra time – Expect congestion before and after school and avoid rushing.

The rule of thumb: Drive as if your own child were crossing the street.

A community-driven cleanup effort, perhaps in partnership with the city, local schools, environmental groups, and residents, could breathe new life into this space. Imagine the terminal grounds free from debris, the sidewalks pressure-washed, signage replaced with modern and aesthetically appealing designs, and lighting improved for both beauty and safety.

A well-maintained terminal area is more than just a visual upgrade — it’s a statement. It says, “We care about this place. We believe in its future.”

2. Decorative Green Space and Parklike Open Space

Now imagine stepping off the ferry and being greeted not by concrete, but by nature — a beautifully landscaped green space that invites you to pause, relax, and enjoy the moment.

Flowering plants, manicured lawns, small walking paths, shaded benches, and even public art installations could transform the area into a true urban oasis. Sculptures by local artists, interpretive signs about the history of Vallejo and Glen Cove, and dedicated spaces for public events or pop-up markets could turn a once utilitarian space into the heartbeat of community engagement.

Let’s not forget the ecological benefits. A greener terminal area contributes to cleaner air, cooler surroundings, and healthier soil. It also gives us something intangible but powerful: a sense of pride and place.

3. Businesses Offering Merchandise and Tourist Paraphernalia

Now picture this: small shops nestled along the waterfront, offering everything from local crafts to nautical-themed gifts, from Glen Cove memorabilia to hand-crafted jewelry.

Tourists visiting Vallejo — either before heading into Napa, exploring Mare Island, or simply riding the ferry for leisure — would have a perfect place to shop and discover the personality of our town.

But it doesn't stop at visitors. Local artisans, creators, and entrepreneurs could rent small kiosks or storefronts to showcase their talents. Weekend markets or "First Fridays" could turn the terminal into a bustling hub of culture and commerce. It's an opportunity to support small businesses, encourage local innovation, and retain tourist dollars right here in Vallejo.

And let's not overlook the importance of design. These businesses could reflect a maritime theme — weathered wood aesthetics, bright coastal colors, nautical lanterns — all evoking that charming harbor-town atmosphere we so often admire in places like Sausalito, Monterey, or yes, Pier 39.

4. Restaurants and Eateries with Formal and Informal Ambiances

Food has a magical way of bringing people together. Whether it's a sit-down dinner with a view of the Carquinez Strait, or a casual clam chowder bread bowl grabbed on the go, food turns any public space into a gathering place.

Imagine a waterfront food court featuring a mix of formal dining establishments, casual cafes, and street food vendors. 5. Ferry Ticket Offices and Visitors Waiting Facility

A modern ferry ticket office — designed with sustainability in mind — could provide clear signage, multilingual support, and digital kiosks for quick transactions. Next to it, a comfortable waiting area outfitted with Wi-Fi, device charging stations, and even a small coffee stand would make ferry travel more enjoyable and accessible.

Add a visitor information booth with maps, event brochures, and friendly volunteers ready to recommend local attractions, and the terminal becomes not just a point of departure — but a gateway to all that Vallejo and Glen Cove have to offer.
