The Lighthouse began a new chapter in its history in 2026. The Simms Auto Group based in Fairfield was interested in purchasing the Glen Cove Marina. If you see illegal fireworks:

- Move away from the area immediately.
- Record location details safely if possible.
- Report activity through the [City of Vallejo fireworks reporting system](#).
- Keep pets indoors during heavy fireworks activity.

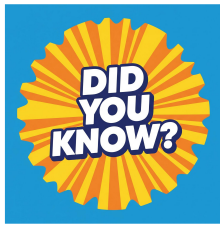

Firewise Community Reminders

Summer in Glen Cove is beautiful, but it also brings elevated wildfire risk, dry vegetation, heat, fireworks, and increased outdoor activity. Here are the biggest summer safety priorities for residents this year:

Wildfire & Vegetation Safety - Glen Cove's hillsides and open-space areas dry out quickly during summer. Recent vegetation fires near Bayhurst and Barrington show how fast conditions can escalate with wind.

Key steps:

- Clear dry brush and weeds around your home.
- Maintain at least 100 feet of defensible space when possible.
- Remove dead plants from fences, decks, and hillsides.
- Keep gutters and roofs free of dry leaves.
- Trim tree branches away from roofs and chimneys.
- Store propane tanks and flammable materials safely.

Like many Bay Area communities, Glen Cove residents occasionally report suspicious activity, vehicle thefts, and wildlife sightings such as coyotes. Helpful habits include:

- Lock vehicles and remove visible valuables.
- Use exterior lighting and cameras if possible.
- Keep pets supervised outdoors, especially early morning and dusk.
- Report suspicious activity promptly.

Glen Cove's Firewise recognition is a major advantage because it improves wildfire preparedness, resident awareness, and firefighter access. The strongest protection comes from neighbors working together:

- Help elderly residents clear vegetation.
- Share evacuation updates.
- Participate in Fire Safe and GCCA meetings.
- Keep emergency access roads clear.

A prepared neighborhood is much safer during California fire season.

Fire Season Is Here — And It Just Hit Home

The “Bayhurst Fire” the morning of May 18, 2026, around 4:30 am, refers to the vegetation fire near Bayhurst Drive in the Glen Cove area of Vallejo. According to reports, the fire burned about three acres on a hillside between Interstate 80, Barrington Drive, and Bayhurst Drive. High winds helped spread the fire, prompting a three-alarm response from the Vallejo Fire Department. Crews were able to stop the forward progress and begin mop-up operations, with no injuries or structure damage reported. Given Glen Cove’s FireWise efforts and the dry offshore wind conditions this week, this is a reminder that vegetation can ignite and spread quickly even early in the season.

On a recent early Monday morning, a wind-driven vegetation fire broke out on the hillside between I-80 and Barrington and Bayhurst drives, right here in Glen Cove. The 3-acre blaze required a three-alarm response from the Vallejo Fire Department. Fortunately, crews stopped it before it reached structures and no injuries were reported — but it was a serious wake-up call.

This fire came during a Red Flag Warning that the National Weather Service issued for Solano County from May 16–19, driven by north winds gusting 35–50 mph and critically low humidity. NOAA has flagged Northern California for above-average wildfire potential starting in June, so conditions are only going to get more challenging from here.

Glen Cove residents who remember the 2019 Glen Cove Fire — 200 acres, I-80 closures, Cal Maritime evacuations — know firsthand how fast things can escalate. Here's what you can do now:

Genasys Protect — Solano County's evacuation zone system. Visit community.genasys.com/a/solano to look up your zone name and write it down. When alerts go out, they'll reference your zone by name.

Get the Apps That Keep You Informed

Alert Solano — Solano County's official emergency notification system. Register at AlertSolano.com to receive evacuation orders, road closures, and severe weather alerts by text, email, or phone. You can register up to five addresses. It's free.

Watch Duty — A free, nonprofit wildfire alert app run by active and retired firefighters, dispatchers, and first responders who monitor radio scanners around the clock. It shows real-time fire locations, perimeters, evacuation zones, air quality, Red Flag Warnings, and even firefighting aircraft — often faster than official government alerts. During the 2025 LA County fires, more than eight million people relied on Watch Duty in a single week. Download it free on the App Store or Google Play.

Prepare Your Property

Clear dry brush, dead leaves, and debris within 5 feet of your home. Keep vegetation "lean and green" out to 100 feet where possible. Clean gutters, screen vents to block embers, and consider fire-resistant landscaping. Cal Fire offers free Wildland Fire Assessments to help you evaluate your property.

Prepare Your Household

Pack a Go-Bag for each family member; it should include medications, important documents (identification cards, insurance papers), phone chargers, water, and a change of clothes. Don't forget supplies and medications for pets. Create a wildfire action plan with evacuation routes and a meeting point, and practice it so everyone in your family knows what to do and where to go.

Solano County held a Wildfire Community Preparedness Day at the Vallejo Ferry Terminal on May 2, and the County recently received a \$151,500 Cal Fire grant specifically to support wildfire planning in our area.

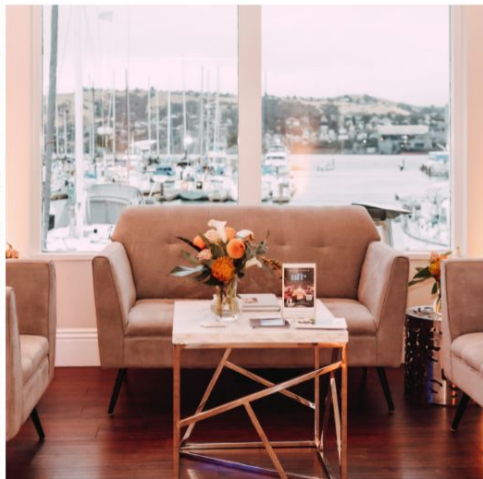

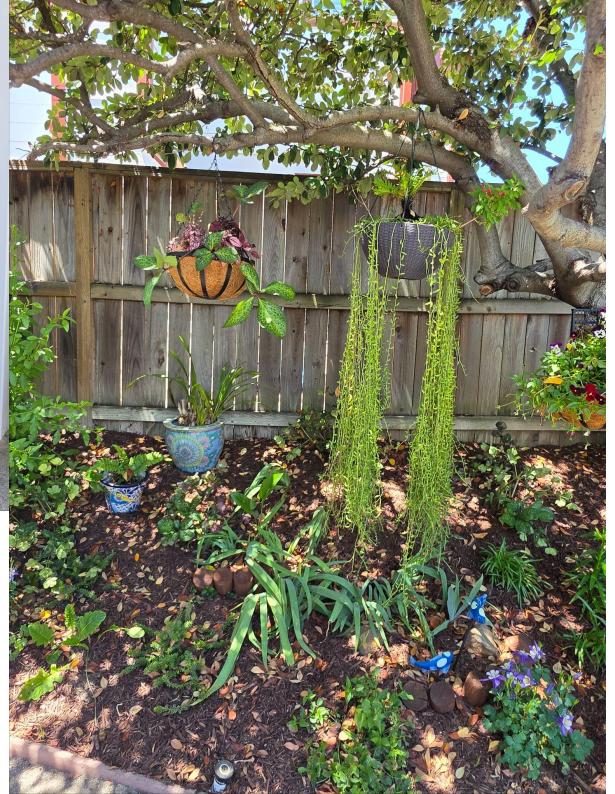

Slope by Glen Cove Monument

There is a sea of small, colorful flags on the slope by the intersection of Old Glen Cove Road and GC Parkway. They were put there during the winter by staff from the Solano Resource Conservation District. At the same time, many native species, provided by the SRCD, were planted. The goal is to create a pollinator garden to increase the populations of variety of pollinators including Monarch butterflies. It appears that the effort is well on its way to success as the tiny seedlings have grown significantly in the last few months.



This effort is a collaboration among the City of Vallejo Public Works Department, New Image Landscape Company, the GCCA Landscape Committee, and the SRCD. The need for this effort became clear years ago when the area was dug up and original plants destroyed by PG&E as part of repair work. Unfortunately, the company was not required to replant the area that had become an eyesore with stumps, weeds, and other unwanted invasive plants.



The SRCD received a grant that would allow staff to obtain the plants needed for the renovation. The COV Public Works Department identified the funds needed to clear and prepare the area, work that was completed by New Image, the company that currently does the maintenance for the entire Glen Cove Landscape Maintenance District. The GCCA Landscape Committee pushed for this work to

be done and for the irrigation to be extended to water the mimosa tree on the right side of the monument.

There is a wide variety of native plants now growing on the slope. A quick look at the area shows a brilliant patch of orange California poppies most of the way up the slope. There are at least two patches of *Asclepias* species, milkweed plants on which Monarchs lay their eggs. Low-growing lupine bushes are also present.

It has been a long time since the GCCA LMD Committee members began advocating for this pollinator garden once we learned SRCD staff were willing to provide seedlings. As these plants mature and become fully established, we look forward to the slope being filled with beautiful, low-water native plantings. We also look forward to the butterflies and other pollinators that will frequent the area.

Alert Solano Emergency Alert System

A Reminder from The Glen Cove Community Association

Alert Solano is the official emergency notification system for Solano County, California. It's used by local authorities to send urgent alerts and information. Receive alerts about:

- Wildfires and evacuations
- Missing persons
- Public safety threats
- Severe weather
- Community-wide emergencies
- Road closures

You can receive alerts via text, e-mail, phone call (landline or mobile), or the AlertSolano app.

Register or update your info at: www.alertsolano.com

During sign-up, you can:

- add multiple phone numbers or emails
- choose which cities or ZIP codes you want alerts for
- opt into specific alert types



How to sign up

Step 1: Go to the official website

Visit: <https://www.alertsolano.com>

You'll be redirected to the Everbridge system, which powers Alert Solano.

Step 2: Create your account

1. Click "Sign Up" (or "Create an account").
2. Enter your name, email, and create a password.
3. You'll receive a confirmation email; open it and click the verification link.

Step 3: Add your contact methods

You can choose multiple ways to be contacted:

- Mobile phone (text and voice)
- Home phone
- Email address

It's best to add both text and email so you don't miss alerts.

Step 4: Add your address

- Enter your home address in Glen Cove, Vallejo.
This ensures you only get alerts relevant to your neighborhood (like wildfire or evacuation notices).
- You can also add work or family addresses if you want alerts for those areas too.

Step 5: Choose your notification preferences

You can opt in to alerts such as:

- Evacuation warnings/orders
- Wildfires
- Severe weather
- Police activity
- Community alerts (road closures, missing persons, etc.)

You can decide how you want each type delivered (text, call, e-mail).

Step 6: Save and test

After finishing your setup:

- Click "Save" or "Finish"

You can send yourself a test alert to confirm everything's working.
